

AURELIO ROCHA, NEW PRESIDENT OF THE CLUBE NAVAL PROMISES A CLUBE FOR ALL MEMBERS

- Mr. President, first of all, congratulations on your election. You were elected President of Clube Naval on May 28. Are you a long time member?
 - "Thank you. I've been a member for over 20 years."

• Do you remember the Clube Naval then?

- "I remember Clube Naval not only at that time but much before that. In colonial times, even if I was not a member, I was going to the Clube Naval trough invitation of friends, members of the Clube. I had this privilege. At that time, the Clube Naval welcomed students parties and final academic year parties. I attended these parties as a member of the organization committee. The Clube Naval was gathering great conditions for the realization of these events."
- As you remember the Clube from the very beginning .. are you Mozambican?
 - "Yes, I am. But that's not the reason I remember.

 There are many people who are not

 Mozambicans and who remember that time."

- Do you practice any nautical activity?
- "No. I just know how to drive a recreational boat (laughs). I have a boat. I like certain water sports, I love sailing, but I do not practice.
- I like swimming, although I am not an expert swimmer. I never participated in competitions, but I like to watch and even participate in those events organization.
- One activity I appreciate very much and I think Clube Naval lost a little this memory is spearfishing. I appreciate the courage and bravery of spear-fishers because it is a very risky modality. Of course it is also a sport that involves high financial costs because it is necessary to have a sophisticated equipment. We had great references in this activity at the Clube Naval, even at international level. We had two or three record-breaking athletes of spearfishing in the African continent."



- · This sport is no longer widely practiced?
- "Not today. It declined since independence. Today we have half dozen people who are trying to reactivate this modality."
- What are your plans and dreams for this mandate? What needs to be improved?
 - "The dreams are not only mine. They belong to all this team. We consider it is very important to give back the Clube Naval to its members. That is our objective. Because the Clube Naval,
- somehow, walked away from its members. And naturally, by reaction, the members moved away from Clube Naval.
- To manage a Clube of this dimension, it is necessary to be sensitive, you need to like nautical things and the Clube. It is necessary that people are aware of the Clube Statutes. The Clube Naval is not ours. It belongs to all members."
